

How to discover a city? Where to start from?

Georges Perec says: "To wander in a foreign city is not an easy thing to do: we tend to go back, afraid of getting lost, and we gladly limit ourselves to the main arteries".

So where do we start from?

"I am here" said Thierry Bouët last year in this same supplement. We could answer "There we are", together, lost, as a start. We take our stance trying to follow the rhythm imposed by the city; round, insisting, circular. Each goes his own way looking for what he's missing. A city is always a sound and visual background which captures you once you are there. Our guides are the sounds, voices, sensations and the people who come to meet us.

We submerged ourselves in Salt and its outskirts for six days, with a daily desire to come back to grasp more subtly the movements, atmosphere and lights.

Each day, while travelling from Amman, we felt a peaceful and tranquil city; which is also rest-

Salt carries within it the composure of an ancient capital that quietly faded away while Amman shone. Salt is like an absent heart, the original artery of a country; but a heart that never stopped beating.





Heather went out with her camera on a snowy day in Kabul. Everyone was happy to go out and play in the snow. She met a group of young boys and followed them on a hill, famous in Kabul for the abandoned

swimming pool that the Russians built. It was a beautiful day with a palpable feeling of peace in the city, something not usually felt there. Heather's TOGETHER is Kabul with a feeling of peace.

TOGETHER IN THE CAMP

There is life in the camp. We work, play, meet, study, have fun, love, all between the streets of the camp. In this small space, with the large amount of people, life has all its meanings. When Sharif moves around the camp with his camera, he lives their stories, with all its daily details.











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Like a child, I colored the map of Jordan

In July 2013, I went on a mission to Arles - south France to attend the famous Rencontres d'Arles, which has been, since last year, a prestigious partner of our young Image Festival. For the first time in Arles, the Institut français in Jordan presented the work of Jordanian photographers that were selected in Amman the previous March, on the occasion of the Night of the Year. There, Julien Mignot, a photographer of NNIPAS Collective, offered to be their next "Master of Ceremony". Organizing a NNIPAS artistic residency in Jordan, under the theme "Together", was, obviously, promising.

But, where would I send NNIPAS team? In which area in Jordan? It has been almost four years that, to my utmost delight, I have been living here. Which territory should I ask them to illustrate? I went almost "everywhere". I took so many small paths in the Hashemite Kingdom, which is so dear to me. Then, like a child, I colored the map of Jordan: "If I went to a specific area, I would color it"... And guess what? Under my eyes, Salt appeared. For nearly four

years, Salt had escaped me. On the map, the city was not colored. What a mistake I had committed! NNIPAS would help me catch up this error.

Because Salt has more to teach us about Jordan than any guidebook published abroad. Because Salt is a crucial city if one wants to understand the soul of Jordan. Because Salt is a city for which people fought, over centuries. Because, after it ceased being the capital city, all attention got diverted from Salt. Because Salt has this special flavor of the places that changed their destiny, places that stopped being what they were to become something else.

"Together", we dedicate the fourth edition of the supplement "Emotions" to the city of Salt. These images have no other ambition than to give back to Salt what belongs to it, today and for a long time.

What is NNIPAS

NNIPAS is the acronym for « Nous N'Irions PAs Si... » (We Would Never Go To If...)

NNIPAS is composed of three photographers (Vincent Catala, Christophe Caudroy, Julien Mignot), one artist illustrator (Camille Rousseau) and one author (Tanguy Bizien). Plus our special guest for this edition, Kim Coiffier (fashion designer).

NNIPAS' protocol is simple: to get familiarized with a certain place for a few days, usually a city, where we would not have gone to if we had not been

together and if a master of ceremony had not imposed it on us.

The ambition of NNIPAS is to deliver an interpretation of a place by proposing a visual, graphic, textual and audio universe created from the situations experienced and felt by the participants; to bring about a world by mixing different media and material of expression within a collective creation. It is the situations that will determine the course of the stories, which will come together to form just one story, that one "would never have gone to if..."

On February 28th, in the evening, Charles-Henri Gros, director of the Institut français in Jordan and master of ceremony handed us a cardboard folder in which we found four letters: S.A.L.T, our destination. Before getting there, we agreed to collect a maximum of traces right from the beginning: sounds, videos, photos. It was necessary to document our journey besides what would be kept and shown on the occasion of the exhibition. We would also need to provide some material to Ebene Quartet, who, between two concerts in the US, would create a melody for us. Same thing in Paris, where, Alexander, sound engineer, would mix voices and different atmospheres that would be sent to him. NNIPAS is a project that involves numerous energies in the hope to render, as closely as possible, the vibrations of a place.

On March 2nd, we discovered Salt, in the company of Nadia Bseiso, Mohammad Nayef and Razan Fakhouri, Jordanian photographers. For six days, we walked throughout the city and its outskirts. We lost one another, we bumped into each other, and, in the evenings, we gathered to try to ponder on the scenography for the exhibition

The opening day approaches and slowly but surely, and ever so gently, Salt appears, it begins to reveal itself. Here are 24 pages with images and words, but this is only a glimpse at what remains to be seen in the exhibition (Zara Centre Gallery / Wadi Saqra & old Salti house below Dar Al Anda Gallery in Jabal Webdeh - from 14th to 31st of March 2014).

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
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
